Highway Code

- 1 Where there is a pavement or footpath, use It!
- 2 Do not walk next to the kerb with your back to the traffic
- 3 Look both ways before you step into the road
- 4 Where there is no footpath, walk on the right hand side of the road.

Road Sense

Crossing the Road

When walking along the road, always use the footpath if one is provided. When there is no path, walk on the right-hand side of the road; it is safer to walk on the side facing on-coming traffic.

There are no magic safe places to cross roads but you should always look for the safest one available. These are the places to look

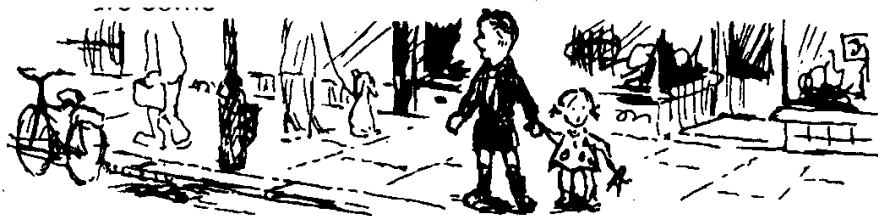

Green Cross Code

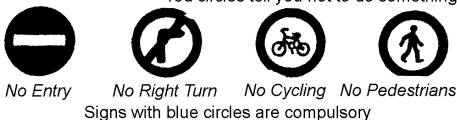
Whenever you want to cross the road, make sure you use the Green Cross Code.

- ❑ Find a safe place away from parked cars, then stop.
- ❑ Stand and wait on the pavement near the kerb.
- ❑ Look all round for traffic and listen.
- ❑ If traffic is coming, let it pass. Look all round again.
- ❑ When there is no traffic near, walk straight across the road.
- ❑ Keep looking and listening for traffic while you cross.

Here are some activities to try:

- ❑ Make a series of pictures to illustrate the Green Cross Code and stick them on a roller TV. Make a tape recording to go with the pictures and give a show to your Pack.
- ❑ Make a poster to help teach younger children about Road Safety.
- ❑ Write the Green Cross Code on strips of card; challenge a friend to put them in the correct order.
- ❑ Teach the Green Cross Code to a younger child.
- ❑ Make up a TV advertisement on the Green Cross Code.

Signs giving orders: these are mostly circular. Those with red circles tell you not to do something



Warning Signs these are mostly triangular with red borders



Information Signs these are usually blue with white symbols



Road Signs

There are four main types of road signs.

- ❑ Signs giving orders (Signs with blue circles are compulsory)
- ❑ Warning Signs
- ❑ Information Signs
- ❑ Direction Signs

Direction Signs: these signs show you the way to different places and differ according to where they are.

Rules for Cyclists

Rules 129 to 137 in The Highway Code are specially written for cyclists. Make sure you have read them before setting out onto roads. Here are some:

- Make sure you check your bicycle is safe to ride before you set off check tyres, brakes, lights, etc.
- Never ride more than two side by side and always in single file on busy, narrow roads.
- When you are riding: always keep both hands on the handlebars except when signalling; always keep both feet on the pedals; do not hold onto other vehicles or cycles; do not carry passengers; always use a cycle path when there is one.

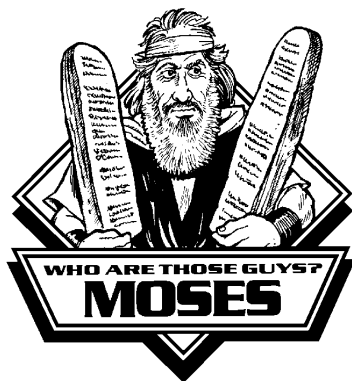
God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses as the people of Israel travelled through the desert.

Bible Character - Paul

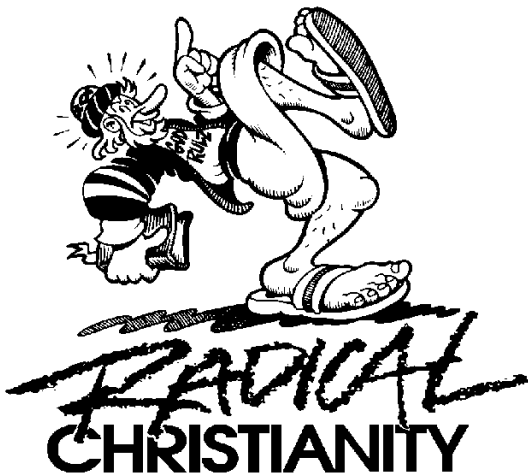
