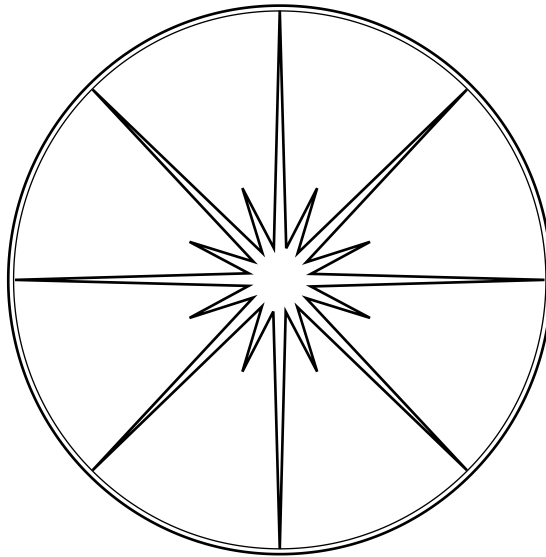

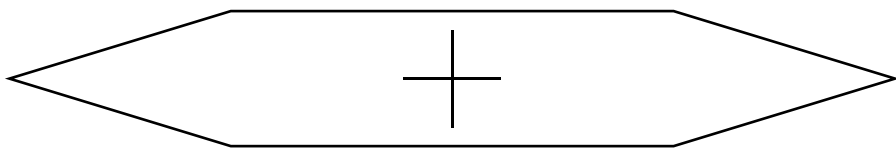
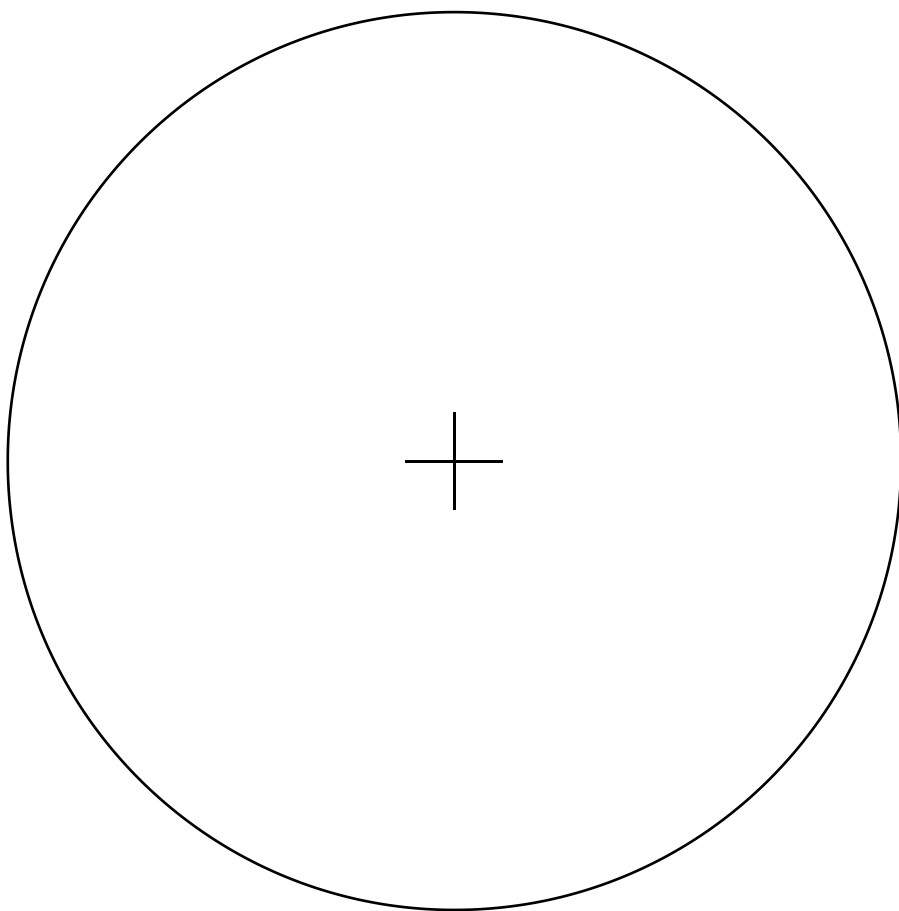
THE COMPASS

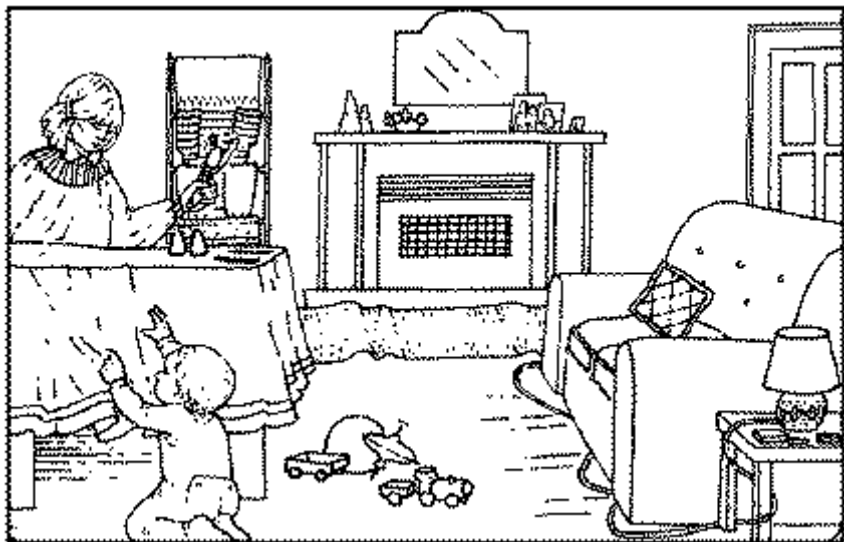

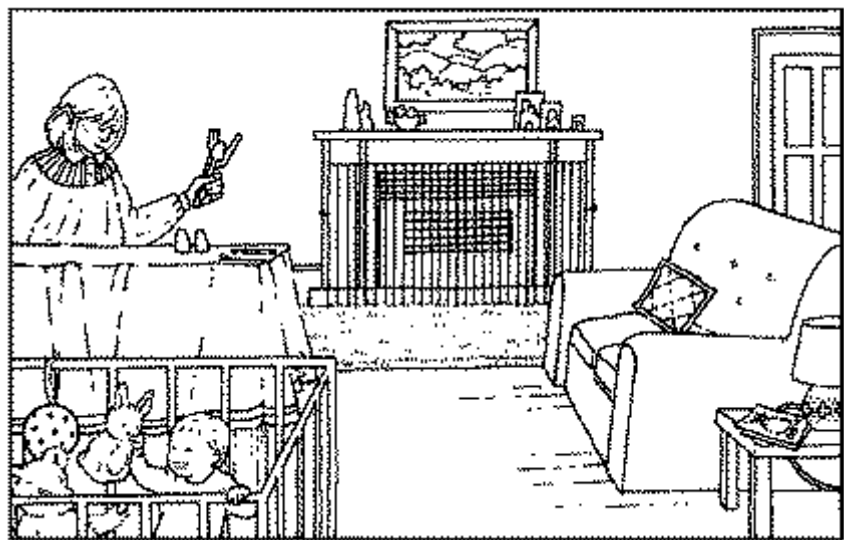

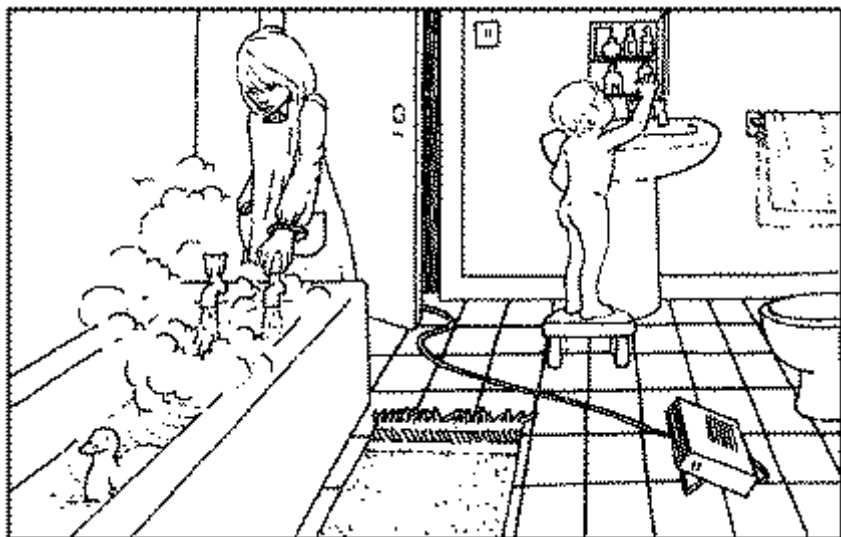

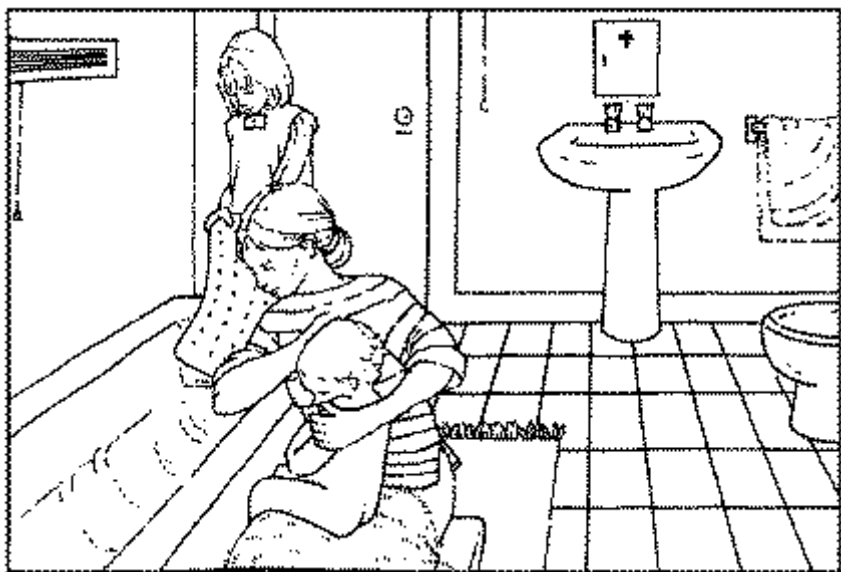

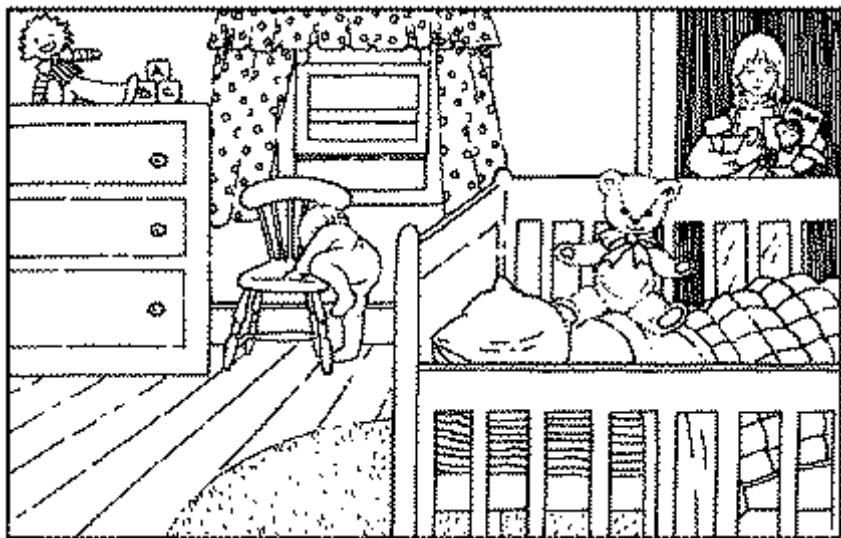

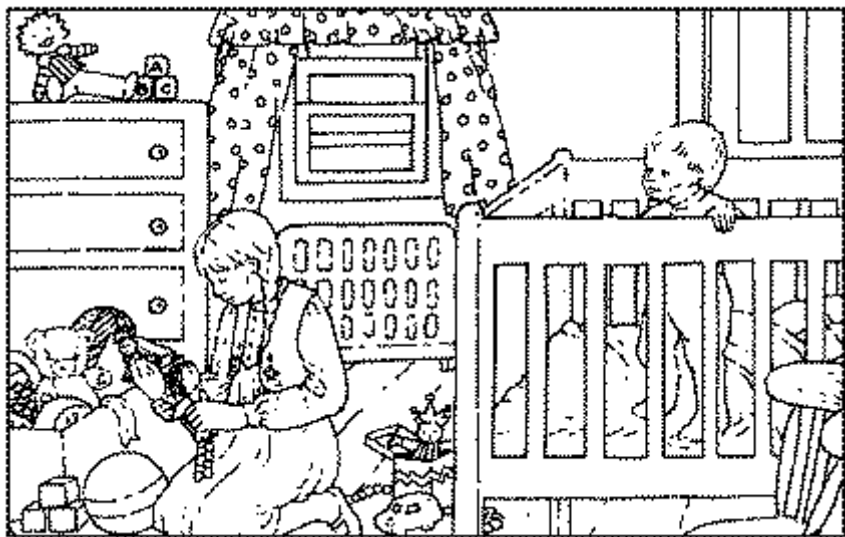

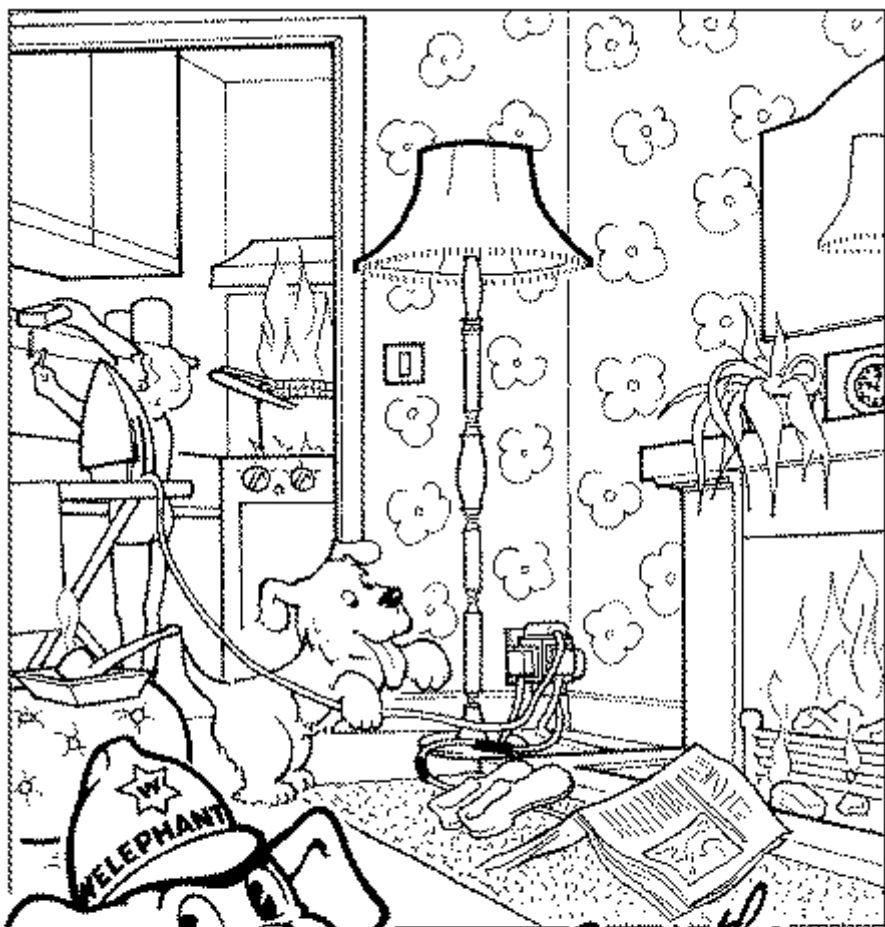

Can you find and mark those countries whose pictures you have been colouring in and learning about.



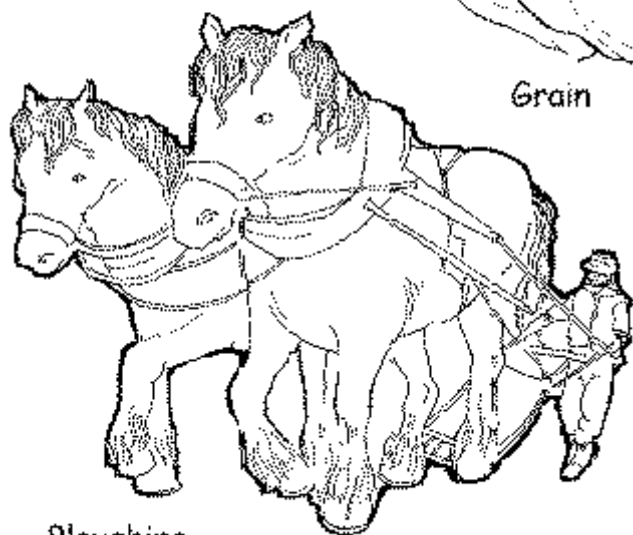
