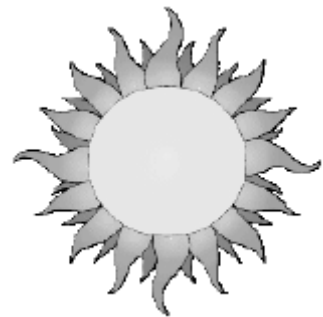
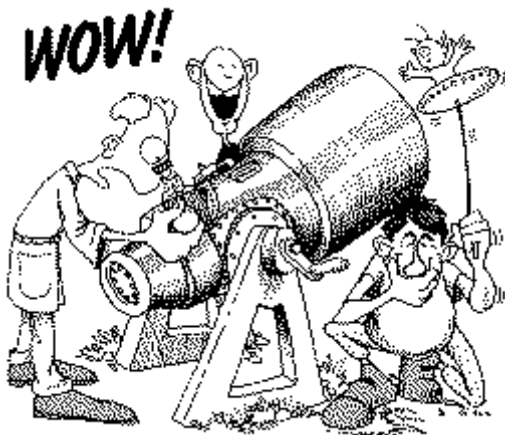

Before we can embark on any outdoor activity we have to be sure that the weather is suitable. In this achievement we are going to learn about the following things: -

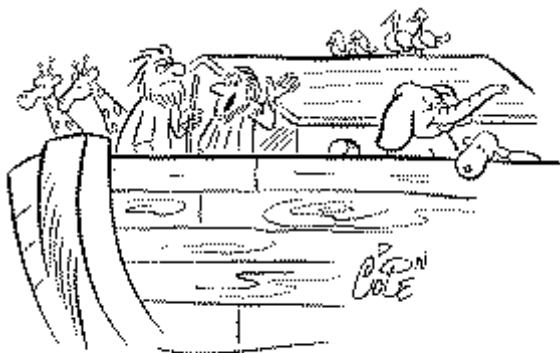
- The temperature

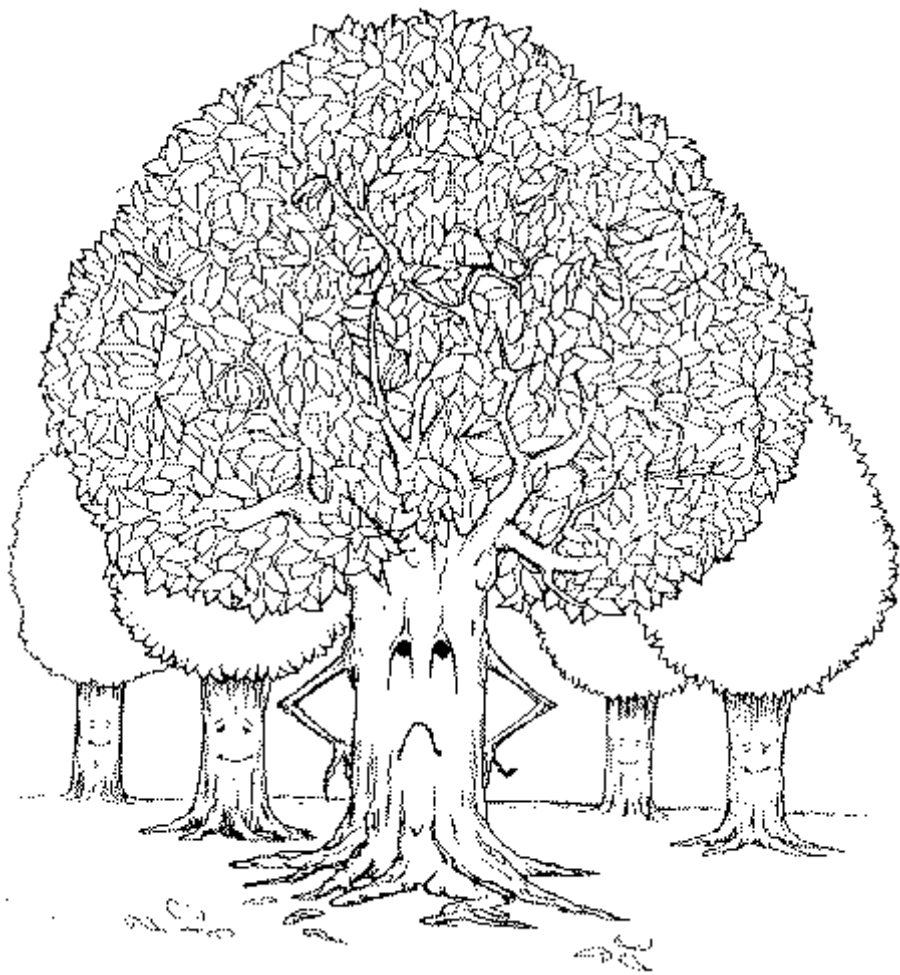

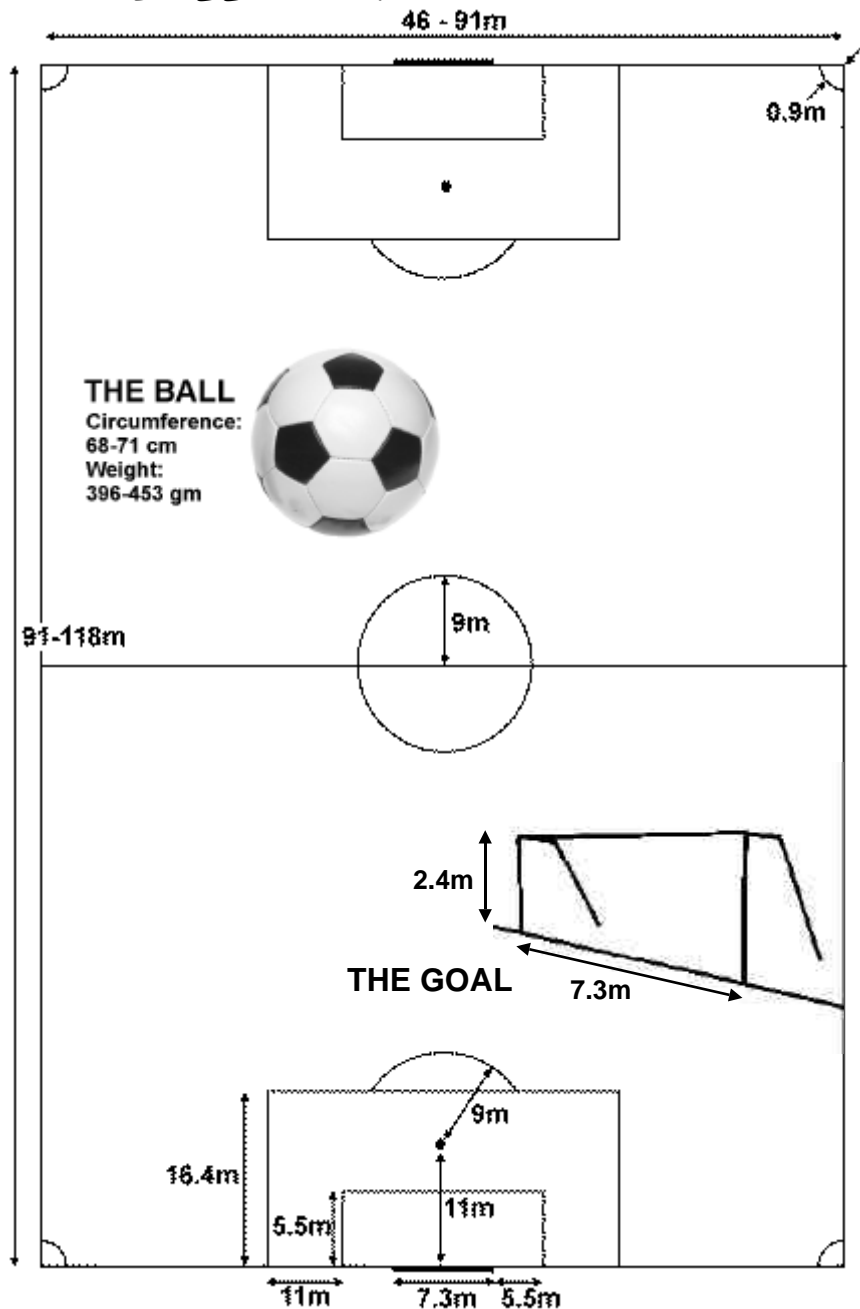

The Bible is the Christians' Holy Book. It is about God. You would find one in every Christian Church

In the Roman Catholic Church ministers are called priests. They are men and not allowed to marry.



Protestant Churches also call their communion, THE LORD'S SUPPER. It may be celebrated every Sunday but is normally held every month or quarter.

Baptism shows that a person has become a member of the Christian Church and it is a sign of God's promise to forgive and give us new life



In the Baptist Church people are not baptised until they are adults. The person goes right under the water as a sign of being washed clean from their past sins.

In other Churches as person is baptised as a baby or child. Their parents promise to bring them up in the Christian way of life

The Anglican Church has men and women VICARS.

COMMUNION is a special service where people eat a piece of bread and drink a sip of wine. This is to remind them that Jesus died for them and that we need Jesus as much as we need our daily food.

Roman Catholics call their communion service MASS. It can be held every day. A wafer of bread is used

All Christians believe that Jesus is God's Son; that he died and rose again from the dead, to bring us back to God, the father

Some people kneel to pray in Church

In the Church of Scotland, the Methodist and the Baptist Church the MINISTERS may be men or women, married or single

Some people stand to pray



In all Christian Churches, Sunday is a special day for worship, when all Christians say the special family prayer that Jesus taught. "Our Father, who art in heaven"
